Summer Family Programme Projects

Planet Earth

Explore ways, small and large, of making a real difference to our environment, looking at practical small changes we can all make (such as creating your own cosmetics), and working on a project such as producing a commercial for water awareness or an environmental report on WSE

Example excursions:

- A biodiversity nature hike
- The Atmosphere Gallery at the Science Museum

Spooky London

London is full of ghosts. This week gives children the chance to learn some of London's best ghost stories, as they work towards producing their own in a variety of formats.

Example excursions:

- A trip to the Monster Supply Shop
- A visit to the Mummies in the British Museum or the London Mithraeum

Theatre and Drama

Shakespeare is just one of the world-famous playwrights to have mastered his art in London. This week enables children as they develop skills around acting, directing and even scriptwriting.

Example excursions:

- A theatre tour
- A visit to some of London's most iconic film sets

Art of London

From Monet to Banksy, London is home to outstanding art & design. Students can try a variety of artistic skills, from replicating the self-portraits of Frida Kahlo to making their own stencils to paint the walls of Wimbledon School of English, plus work on a creative project based on an artist, technique or art & design movement of their choice.

Example excursions:

- Finding Banksy paintings in Camden
- A trip to one of London's many world-class art galleries
